

### Ask That Lawndale Either Be Paved or Vacated

Commissioners will soon set a preliminary hearing date to determine whether Lawndale avenue, between Hunter boulevard and Oakland, should be paved or vacated.

At the present time Lawndale provides easy access from Hunter boulevard to Oakland for cars desiring to reach that location. But as the street is now a gravel roadway, it raises continuous clouds of dust when they do so.

Either paving the street or vacating it entirely, would relieve nearby residents of this nuisance, City Manager Donald C. Egbert said.


