

### Krege Announces New Vacation Plan For Its Employees

Employees of the S. S. Krege store at 183 N. Woodward, will have a chance to fun and sun a little longer this summer due to the firm's new vacation schedule, says Manager H. L. Sellers.

Store employees with six months to one year's service with the company receive one week vacation with pay. Those with one to five years' service receive two weeks with pay; those with five to ten years' service receive three weeks with pay and those with 25 years or more, four weeks with pay. Employees who entered the service of the company after March 1, 1947, are allowed to take vacations without pay before August 30, 1947.

Service time for determining vacations for men and women returning to Krege's from military service before August 30, 1947, figured from the date of employment including time spent in the armed services.

### June 7 Girl Scout Penny Drive Plans Nearly Complete

Plans for the Birmingham Girl Scouts' annual Penny Drive, only event during the year which raises money strictly for the use of Birmingham Girl Scouts, are nearing completion, Mrs. Raymond Bower, chairman of the drive, announced this week.

The date of the drive has been set for Saturday, June 7, and it will be carried on by the Girl Scouts themselves who will lay tape along the main business sections of town; the idea being for as many people as possible to lay pennies on the tape during the day.

The pennies thus collected are to be used for the maintenance of the Girl Scout cabin at Springdale Park which accommodates many girls each year, training them in camping lore, in taking care of themselves and in preparing them for away-from-home camping.

Other purposes for the funds are for the professional training of volunteer adult leaders—many of which are needed in this area—for materials to carry on the work of Girl Scouting.

**Work in Various Crafts**

"Last year 280 girls spent nights at the cabin with their leaders," Mrs. Bower stated, "and 73 girls attended the day-camp there. Day-camp actually gives the girls five full days of camping, for they sleep at home instead of at the cabin.

"There they work away at the different crafts: leather work, ceramics, weaving, sketching, metal work, book binding and blueprinting; and also do their own out-of-door cooking and take many nature adventure hikes. Participation in sports and singing is part of the program, and Scouts are encouraged in any community service.

"This year the Day-camp will open for intermediate girls the week of July 7, and 50 scouts will be accommodated—The Brownie group will have their opportunity for day-camping during the week of July 14, when another 50 girls will go to camp.

"During the year, the money raised is part of the fund for next Saturday will be spent on arts and crafts in the different troops, music, community service, out-of-door activities, and on field trips to places of education and interest.

"The more than 30 Girl Scout Troops in Birmingham have a membership of over 500 girls, each deriving benefit from the drive. Over one hundred adults are now volunteering their time for Scout work.
