Many New Y Camp Activities Set For This Summer

Birmingham boys who plan to do their camping this year at the YMCA Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See will be doing it under expert leadership this year, it is reported.

Camp Director S. N. Geal announced the addition of a new staff member, Clifford Roberts, who will feature instruction in the use of all types of fishing tackle and rifery.

"Roberts was raised in the midst of trout country, near Black, Rainey, Okeese, Pigeon and Sturgeon Rivers," Geal said, "and has had many years of lake fishing experience. He was associated with the Conservation Department's fish spawning experiments at Douglas Lake and has taught many courses in fishing, including fly-tying."

"His instruction at Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See will include this course, along with where-to-fish, fish and game regulations, bait casting, care of line, safety in fishing, kinds of bait, and where-to-find-bait."

Many Other Activities

The courses will include several fishing expeditions. Roberts secured his training in rifery in the Army, is reportedly a hunter of considerable experience, and had supervision of the skeet shooting at the Black Lake Sportsman's Club. His instruction at the Camp will include the tests and awards of the National Rifle Association.

In addition to the added fishing and rifery courses, the many other activities at Camp Mahn-Go-Tah-See will be included as they are every year.

Under the direction of Birmingham's Miles W. Robinson will be the instruction in sailing, boating and swimming. He will be assisted by five Red Cross senior life savers.

Martin Redmond will be riding master this year, supervising all the boys' horseback riding; canoe and truck trips will be under the direction of Howard Sumera, and nature lore and photography will be supervised by Homer Roberts of Birmingham.

Years of Experience

"These men, all of whom have had years of experience, are reported for their proficiency in their particular fields," Geal stated, "but above all they love to be with the boys."

"Many other activities are on the roster of summer fun at the improved camp, as the total staff at Mahn-Go-Tah-See includes 28 men and women, all interested in contributing something to the fun, adventure and experience of the boys in Oakland County through their particular skills."

Many improvements have been made at the Camp for this season, including new log sleeping cabins equipped with steel cots and mattresses, an entirely new modern sanitation plant, and three new 17-foot canoes.
