A dads vs. daughters baseball game is planned. Each girl will pack a picnic dinner for her father and herself.

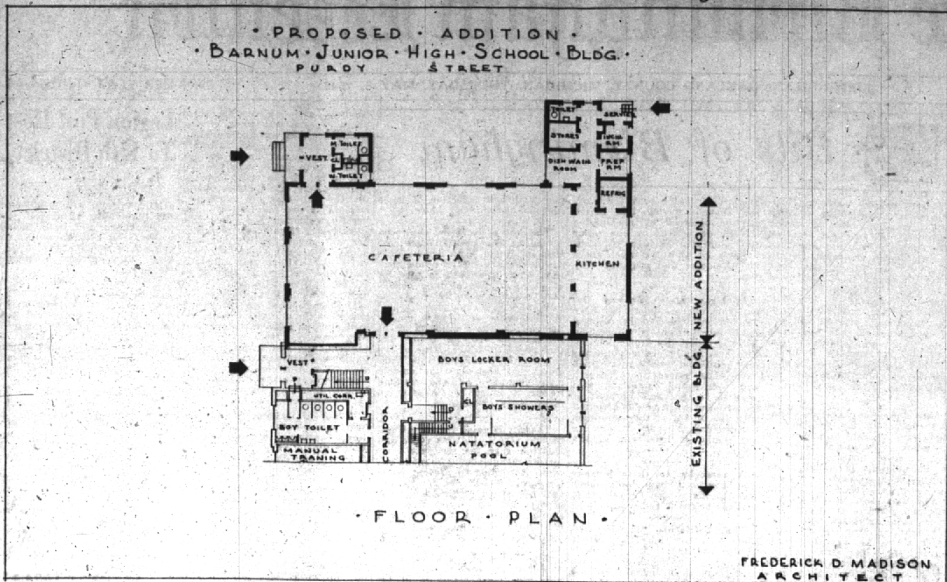
The general chairman is Ann Lumbert, doing invitations are Barb Huesch, chairman, Mary Gilchrist, Sally Buck and Sherill Williams.

**Woodward Hospital  
Benefit Concert  
Is Set for Tonight**

In order to benefit the Woodward General Hospital Building Fund, concertmaster Joseph Gindgold of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra will be at the Royal Oak High School auditorium tonight when he will be soloist of the evening with the South Oakland Symphony Orchestra.

With his friend and associate, Dirk von Emmert, first oboist of the Detroit Symphony, who is conductor of this amateur citizens' orchestra, he will lend his talent and time for the occasion.

Gindgold, after he finishes the present symphony season, leaves Detroit to join the Cleveland Symphony, so it will be one of the few remaining opportunities for

people of this area to hear him. Born in Breslau, Poland, of Russian-Polish descent, Gindgold started taking violin lessons at the age of 3 on a family-owned violin, the only one his father could afford. During World War I, when yet a youngster, he helped provide food and clothing for his family by playing in army camps. When the family found its way to New York, they used every effort to give young Joseph music lessons. Finally, at the age of 16, he made his debut at Town Hall and was hailed as a coming star.

Since then he has studied in Brussels under the great Eugene Ysaye, toured Europe, and played in the NBC Symphony, Primrose String Quartet, and many other great number of symphony orchestras as their guest before coming to Detroit.

Five numbers of the concert will be played by Gindgold.

Formal opening of the former Phil's Market on the west side of Birmingham will take place under new management this week and according to Nate Kaplan, new proprietor of the food store. It is located on West Maple at Chesterfield and will be known in the future as the Quorum Food Market.

Kaplan has been in the retail food business for the past 20 years, most of which were spent as proprietor of a store in Grosse Pointe. He sold out there two years ago and went to Los Angeles where he operated a market until his recent return to Michigan.

He purchased his present business from Phil Vitari who has operated a food market near that location for the past several years. Vitari completed the new building, which besides housing

the market contains Bette's Beauty Shop and Mills Pharmacy, last summer. He will retain ownership of the building.

Kaplan also announced that Bates Miller, who has operated the meat department in the store for the past year, will continue to do so. He also stated that a bakery department will be added in the near future.
