HOW TO Care For Your Dog

IMMUNIZATION FOR CANINE DISTEMPER

You can protect your dog from distemper by increasing his immunity to the disease through a vaccination procedure.

Since puppyhood is the period when dogs are most apt to contract the disease, the dog should be immunized as soon as it reaches three months of age. Some veterinarians prefer the puppy to be even younger.

There are several accepted methods of distemper immunization. The proper method in any particular case can only be determined by the veterinarian.

Also, there are variations of the acceptable methods which have been developed by veterinarians all over the country which have been found suitable for their local conditions and the various states of physical condition of the animal.

All animals that are immunized will not be absolutely sure of not contracting the disease since immunity may vary in degree.
