

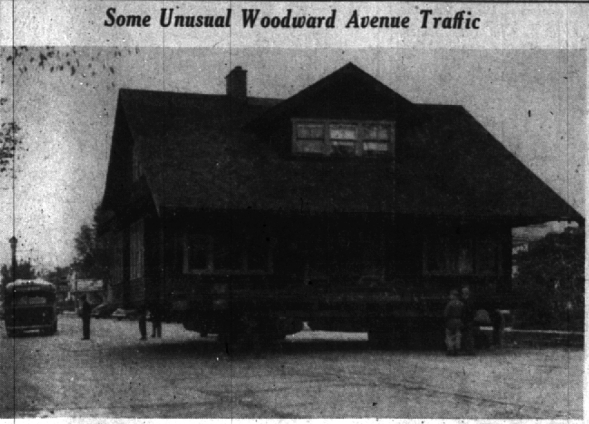

Dr. Charles Joy to Address SCF Here Wednesday
Dr. Charles Joy will address the luncheon meeting of the Save the Children Federation at the Community House next Wednesday at 1 o'clock.
Dr. Joy is an associate director

of the SCF and former European commissioner of the Unitarian service committee and later executive director. He is a graduate of Harvard University and Andover Seminary and has served parishes in St. Louis, Cincinnati and various New England cities. He left this work when he became administrative vice-president of the Unitarian service committee, and during World War I served in France as regional director of the YMCA. He will speak here on the conditions in Europe, where he has been for some time making a survey for the Federation. He covered Holland, Belgium, France, Poland, Italy, Austria and Greece by plane, train and automobile, and has seen, first hand, the deso-

lation there. He has watched the efforts being made towards recovery and has learned the chief danger areas of starvation and disease.
At present he is touring the United States speaking for what is regarded as one of the finest private relief programs for children in the world.
Mrs. Rudolph Esch, president of the local SCF chapter, in announcing his coming here said, "We are all familiar with the existing needs in Europe, and are indeed fortunate to be able to hear a man who is in a position to interpret these reports in the light of his own observations. He knows where help is needed most, and has been particularly concerned with the situation among the children. In a few years these youngsters will be taking charge of European affairs, and it is up to us to see that they are taken care of physically, in order that they may grow mentally and morally into the type of men and women who can capably govern such vast territories."
"Dr. Joy speaks with passionate regard for the welfare of these children, combining it with clear judgment concerning the most practical ways in which we can help them now, so they may help themselves and their fellowmen later."

The appointment is based on the cadet's military and efficiency records at the academy.

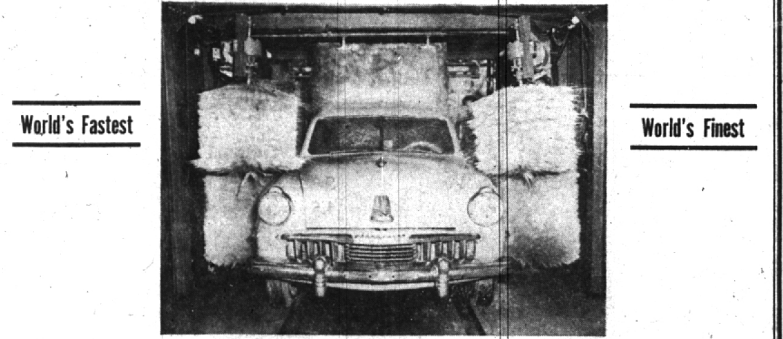
