PEANUT ROAST

1 tbs. chopped onion	1 cup bread crumbs
1 tbs. chopped celery	1 cup green pea pulp
2 tbs. fat	1 juice of ½ lemon
¼ cup hot water	1 tsp. salt
1 ½ cups chopped peanuts	¼ tsp. pepper
1 egg	

Brown onion and celery in hot fat until golden brown. Add hot water and simmer until tender. Mix other ingredients, adding egg last. Combine with celery and onion. Pack into a greased baking dish and bake at 350 degrees until golden brown. Serve with either white sauce or tomato sauce.

SWEETBREADS SUPREME

¼ lb. sweetbreads	2 tbs. flour
1 pt. fresh mushrooms or one large can stems and pieces	1 ½ cups milk
2 tbs. fat	

Pre-cook sweetbreads and dice. Add mushrooms, sliced, to fat and cook slowly five minutes. Sprinkle with flour, blend and add milk, dried beef and sweetbreads. Cook slowly until thickened, stirring occasionally. Serve on toast. Serves 4.
