Dr. Charles Joy Tells SCF of Europe's Needs

Dr. Charles R. Joy, associate executive director of the National Board of the Save the Children Federation, spoke before the local group at a luncheon meeting held in the Community House last week.

Dr. Joy has just returned from an extensive tour of Europe where he saw first hand the great need there, and the amount of work which the SCF is now doing. He stressed the need for the continued support of the SCF for the support of 19 schools and on the wonderful response made to the plea for used clothing and for Christmas.

Need Help Now

"Europe's most dire moment is now," he told his listeners. "The 'little people' in hundreds of European cities and villages are depending on America for the support which will lead them to political, economic stability. These areas have had three decades of almost continuous dislocation. They are suffering now not only from the havoc of actual warfare, but also from the lack of food, medical supplies and the severe winter of last year plus the unprecedented droughts of the past growing season."

Could Not Believe Eyes

"No word picture can tell you," he said, "of the horrors they are living through. Everywhere one sees children waiting away from tuberculosis. I have seen tiny babies with no more protection from the elements than a few scraps of newspaper wrapped around their skeletal bodies. I have seen little children in school suffering from scabies because they had no soap with which to get clean."

"In one Balkan country I looked in an orphanage and could not believe my eyes, when I saw children eating clay. I found out that this practice they had a sweet taste, and the children in their desperate hunger eat it. Whether it has any value or not is not the question with them. It fills their little stomachs and relieves the constant hunger pangs. They are so near starvation that they are thankful for even this."

Dr. Joy left the lasting impression that it is of the utmost importance that we give whatever support we can. It is the family group which is struggling to keep alive, to keep together, to improve their lot with the crudest tools and materials, that is building those huge areas of Europe back into some semblance of civilized order. It is up to Americans to support them for they are barely touched by their own central governments in their efforts at rehabilitation.

Nothing Wasted

In speaking of the packages sent, Dr. Joy said, "Do not think for one minute that they are not appreciated. You should see them meet one thing, not even the strings and the wrappings are discarded."

"Packages containing layettes are most gratefully received, for the mothers know of the suffering of their babies, and with their own meager supplies and resources can do almost nothing for them. At least four babies use each layette, as the mothers share the precious articles with those less fortunate."

"There are no baby clothes nor diapers available in any part of Central Europe so that the tiny tots, the ones who will some day have the fate of the continent in their hands, are dependent entirely on gifts from more fortunate nations," he said.

Layette Committee
