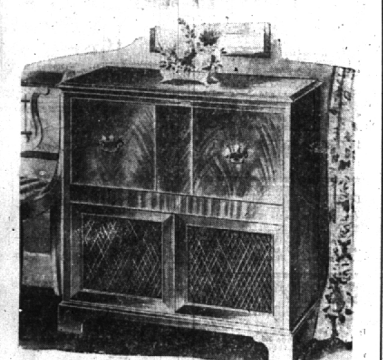
The colored movie which was a part of this observance of National Girl Scout Week, was taken by Mrs. Pretz when she visited in Europe.

BIRMINGHAM VETERANS from the Office of Veterans Affairs Lansing

New Rules, announced by the War Department embodied in a circular changing the Army Regulations regarding decorations, provide that all persons who in the period between Pearl Harbor and the end of the war, individually or for their part in groups, but will be eligible for award of the Bronze Star.

Frequently during combat, field units issued general orders or formal certificates to individuals for their acts and these, individually by the War Department on their merits, may also be used in support for the medal award.

Warrant Officers, flight officers and other personnel who served honorably for at least six months on active Federal service in the O.R.C. Regulations require applicants to be at least 21 years of age and that they must not have passed their 25th birthday at time of appointment in the Reserve.

Former Army personnel who, while serving in one of the first three grades of enlisted men, Warrant Officer, or Flight Officer, were recommended for commission, but who were taken prisoner-of-war, or otherwise, in final action on the recommendation, may apply for reserve commission as First Lieutenant or Captain, as appropriate section, Colonel A. H. Cummings the Senior Instructor for the Organized Reserves stated today. Maximum age limit is 35 years.

Former enlisted personnel with a minimum of 6 months service in the Army of the United States between December 7, 1941 and June 30, 1947, who are graduates of accredited colleges where ROTC advanced training was non-existent, or where the academic training period prior to graduation was not sufficient duration for the award of a commission, may apply for ROTC course, may apply for ROTC course, may apply for ROTC course, may apply for ROTC course.

Atom Scientist to Address AAUW Next Wednesday

"How soon will atomic energy benefit the average man?" will be the timely question which Dr. Gal Brexton will ask his audience Wednesday afternoon, Dr. Brewster, head of the Physics department of Lawrence Institute of Technology, will address the November meeting of the Birmingham Branch of the American Association of University Women.

He has been the head of this department for the past 15 years, and during the war served with the Detroit staff of the Chief of Ordnance. He is an ex-president of the Detroit Physics club, and former vice-president of the Michigan Society of Spectroscopy. At present he is a member of the committees of the Physics section of the American Association of Engineering Education.

In addition to his talk, Dr. Brewster will show the motion picture, "Operation Crossroads," the official film of the atomic bombing of Bikini Island.

Mental Hygienists to Address County Group Here Monday

The Oakland County Chapter of the Michigan Society for Mental Hygiene will meet Monday evening at 8:15 in the Guild Hall of Christ Church Cranbrook, according to an announcement made by Mrs. Henry S. Booth, chairman.

The meeting is open to the general public, and is one of great interest to all.

Mrs. J. F. Fitz-Simons, Ph.D., psychologist in the Green Pointe schools and Don Weaver, formerly principal of the Waterford Township school, will speak of "Mental Health Resources in Oakland County Schools." Following their talks, a period of open discussion will be held.

According to figures released by the society, it is quite reliably estimated that of every 7,000 infants born in this country, 270, or one in 26, will eventually suffer some form of abnormality of the mind. By the time these children reach the age of 15, one out of 22 will face the prospect of some day being confined in a mental institution.

"Schools," the society believes, "can do much to prevent mental and emotional disorders. Such a problem should challenge the interest of every thinking person."
