In his recent book, "Breaking Frankly," former Secretary of State James F. Byrnes declares that the best answer to the atomic bomb is "with better atomic bombs." Mr. Byrnes admits that if Russia does not show that it has no "operational atomic bomb," the situation could lead to World War III. Mr. Byrnes, noted as a peace-making compromiser who he was in Congress, does not seek war; but he is realistic enough to know that the present Russian policy of non-cooperation eventually will lead to war—at a time when Russia is better prepared to wage war. The utterances of Mr. Byrnes add to the growing belief in this country that Russian Communism and American freedom cannot mix, or even get along together. I agree with Mr. Byrnes that our country should get "tough" with the Stalin crowd, who, if handled correctly, may be brought in line with the international peace aims of all freedom-loving people.
