Girl Scout Week Opens October 26

Sunday, Oct. 26, will mark the opening of Girl Scout Week, when the 500 registered Girl Scouts of Birmingham will join a million and a quarter members of their organization throughout the nation to honor the memory of the founder, Juliette Gordon Low.

According to Mrs. R. W. Reilly, president of the Birmingham Girl Scout Council, Girl Scout Week this year will be celebrated as the climax of the 35th Anniversary being observed throughout 1947. Birmingham's observance of the week will begin with a vesper service Sunday, October 26, at the Community House, at 5 p. m., to which parents are invited. Scouts will be recognized at the morning service in their own churches, at which time they will wear their uniforms.

Highlight of Week

A highlight of the week's observance will be the colorful presentation: "Customs and Costumes of Middle Europe," to be given Tuesday, Oct. 28, at Barnum School at 4 p. m.

This brilliant costume show and movie is being presented for all Browns and Girl Scouts by Mrs. Philip Pritz in the interests of the Save the Children Federation. Authentic costumes collected by Mrs. Pritz in Europe will be modeled, and movies shown picturing the original owners wearing the costumes.

Birmingham Girl Scouts are particularly interested in Save the Children Federation, as their expression of world friendship is being directed thru that organization this year. String orange bags are being filled as Christmas kits by every Girl Scout to be distributed to European children through the Federation.

Organized in 1912

"Girl Scout Week" has been observed annually for more than two decades," Mrs. Reilly explained. "Oct. 31 is the anniversary of Juliette Low's birth and Girl Scout Week always encompasses this date. Mrs. Low, a close friend of Lord Robert Baden-Powell, who originated the Scouting movement for both boys and girls, organized the first Girl Scout troop in the United States on March 12, 1912.

"She died in 1927, having lived to see the organization she founded spread from coast to coast and develop close affiliations with Girl Guide and Girl Scout groups on every continent through the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts."
