

### Army Recruiting Is to Be Handled From Royal Oak Office

"The four of us each got a bull moose, one on each of the four hunting days," Fletcher reported.

The hunting was done from canoes on the Trout River in the game reserve west of Chapleau, Ontario.

"The trip to the hunting grounds took us three days with plenty of

padding each day," Fletcher said. "And we encountered the usual number of portages. The weather was extremely warm and it was necessary to send back one of the guides to Chapleau to arrange for a plane to get the moose meat to cold storage."

One of the many incidents Fletcher recalled was a swim the party took in a river which flowed north into James Bay.

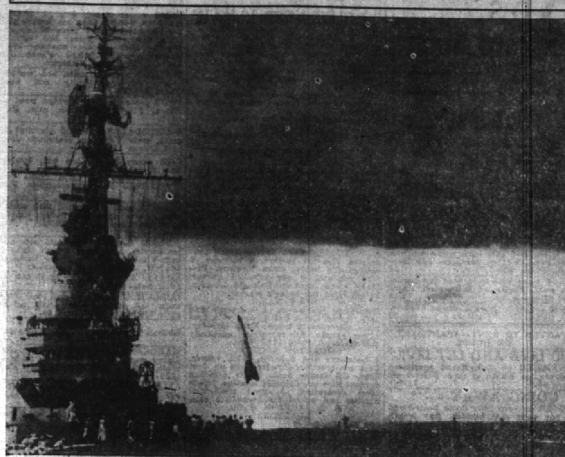
"That's a very unusual happening in the latter part of October," he said.

### ROCKET LAUNCHING MARKS NEW ERA IN NAVAL WEAPONS



Marking "the beginning of a new era in naval weapons," the United States Navy fired a captured German V-2 rocket from the flight deck of the 45,000 ton aircraft carrier USS Midway on September 8, 1947. This was the first time in history a rocket has been launched from ships or a moving platform. The primary purpose of the experiment, held at sea several hundred miles off the East Coast of the United States, was to ascertain if large bombardment rockets could be fired off modern aircraft carriers without modifications affecting flight operations. J. Mohammad Ali Allison, former Birmingham resident now living in New York City, dropped into the Eccentric editorial offices Tuesday afternoon and declared, "Birmingham certainly has progressed in the past 21 years." His Birmingham friends will remember him without the addition of "Allison" to his name. That is an English innovation of around 1465, he explained. "Asiatics do not have surnames, but since I am an American citizen, I thought it best to acquire one," he stated. Mohammad Ali was given his citizenship papers on June 27, 1921, while he resided in Birmingham. But on Sept. 1, 1925, they were taken away from him by a Congressional act which deprived Asiatics of American citizenship. But after the recent war, that law was changed to permit Indians to again become citizens, and just last August 6 he regained full citizenship status. A gift importer, he was in the city to pay a business call upon several local firms.
