Scholarships, attractive salaries, and encouragement on the part of present teachers must be used to attract the best young people of each graduating class into the profession of teaching.

There are other factors which will result in a steady improvement in connection with improved salaries in teaching. The assistant commissioner of education in charge of secondary schools in New York has suggested the need for a school year of forty-four to forty-eight weeks as compared with the present school year of forty weeks.

### Show Pictures of Yellowstone Trip

The 'Y' Beegees and Phalanx Club joined forces last Tuesday evening to preview the 10 mm. picture of the Yellowstone-Birmingham YMCA trip to Yellowstone National Park, Pike's Peak, Canyon of the Gods, and the beautiful hills of Colorado.

Legislation alone will never be enough to hold the gains that have been made and accomplish the gains which must be made if education is to fill the role of 18 in any degree of adequacy. It is not enough to say that a minimum salary of twenty-four hundred dollars must be paid to all teachers with a baccalaureate degree and no experience.

Meeting arbitrary standards will not necessarily improve instruction in the classroom. Nor will it necessarily preserve a public appreciation for the further need of public school support, if democratic competence is the goal of every boy and girl.

Without that enthusiasm on the part of both the teachers and the public, education will not improve as it should.

Certainly, legislation alone will not be enough. Because of this firm conviction, the general teachers meetings for the school year 1947-48 in the Birmingham Public Schools will be devoted to the theme "The Fine Art of Teaching," and an effort will be put forth to make teachers in the Birmingham Public Schools aware of the need not only for increased efficiency within the classroom but also for improved public relations which will preserve the very fine support which has built up the special election last year when eighty-three per cent of the voters cast votes in favor of an increased public support.

The teacher must realize that she is a public relations agent every day, whether her contact be with the pupil, the parent, or the community. Many people have their opinion of the school based largely upon the remarks of Mary or Johnny at the dinner table.

competently in a democratic society. On the basis of these premises the teachers of the Birmingham Public Schools are urged to do their part, individually and collectively, to create a situation in the Birmingham schools during 1947-48 which will result in happy and world wide recognition, confidence, and instructional efficiency so that children will truly be prepared in having spent the school year 1947-48 in the Birmingham Public Schools.

Children convey to their parents the impression of the school room and the relative success with which they have done their work as well as the teacher's interest and disposition. Perhaps this is one of the best ways of evaluating the work in the classroom.

Teachers' relationships with parents are important if public relations are to be conducted in a healthy school situation. They can be cultivated by the work of previous teachers or by insinuating that the background of the child is inadequate for the work she proposes to give the child.

Marked by Objective. It is sometimes difficult to appreciate some of the circumstances of the past, and it would be much better to try to understand the child as he is and adjust the program to his present needs, interests, and abilities.

By sharing experiences with other teachers by cooperating to the fullest extent, and displaying a professional loyalty, the faculty will be aided together into a harmonious working unit motivated by the interest in a common objective—the growth and development of boys and girls to live

competently in a democratic society.
