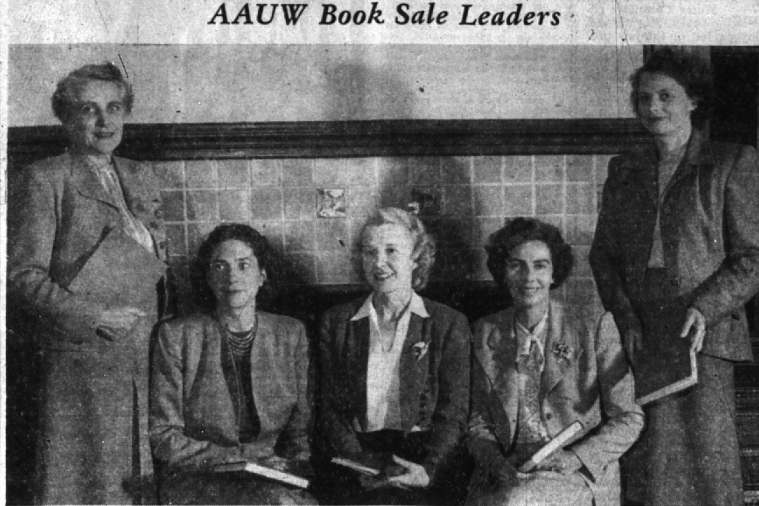

In past years, there will be books of every type, fiction and non-fiction, light reading and books which are suitable for research. The reading of titles and authors will enable one to pick up many books sought after by readers. There will also be textbooks and sets of educational books of great value to students. Phonograph records, magazines, picture frames, games and patterns will be sold, too.

The money derived from this sale is turned mainly into educational channels, and goes to the national fellowship fund, scholarships and general educational activities. Last year the A.A.U.W. awarded a \$350 scholarship to Miss Helen Dynl of Big Beaver, who is

now enrolled in Capiot University at Columbus, Ohio. Many study groups are conducted by the group which the public is invited to join. Too, during the past two years, the A. A. U. W. has given \$125 to the drive against polio.

Books are being solicited from anyone interested in the work of the association. They, or magazines and other articles, may be taken to the Detroit Edison office, or if this is not convenient for the donor, Mrs. Richard Brown will arrange transportation of them. Those in charge of these arrangements in the outlying districts are Mrs. Lawton Tabor of Beverly Hills, Mrs. Paul Ziegelbauer of Franklin, Mrs. Maxwell Fead of Foxcroft and Mrs. Howard Stiegel in Bloomfield Hills.

In past years over 3,000 articles have been sold during the week. This year, Mrs. Schjolin reports, it appears, through contributions and the advance interest being shown, will be equally, if not more, successful.
