To fill vacancies, five new instructors were added to the Baldwin teaching staff this fall.

Perhaps the greatest interest in new head football and baseball coach Vincent Scintone, who for nearly three weeks has been busy in training the Maple football squad.

Coach Scintone graduated from the University of Michigan where he played tackle. After more than two years in the Army Air Force he returned to coach St. Thomas high school of Ann Arbor and then his work at the University. He then coached two years at Kiski prep school at Saltburg, Pa. Besides coaching, Scintone has charge of boys' physical education and health classes and teaches one class of United States history.

He coached three years at Michigan State Normal College in Ypsilanti before going a five year hitch in the Navy. In 1946 he finished his college course.
