As a member of the Interstate Preparatory School League, Cranbrook School in Bloomfield Hills will have Western Reserve Academy of Hudson, Ohio, and Shady Side Academy of Pittsburgh as rivals on the soccer and football fields this fall. The season opens with a soccer game on Oct. 4 at 2 p.m. with Chatham Collegiate of Ontario as the opponents and the football schedule begins with Lake Forest Academy on Oct. 11. The cross-country season opens the following Friday, Oct. 17, when Birmingham High School will furnish the opposition over the Cranbrook course.

The coming season is Cranbrook's second year of organized varsity soccer since before the war. In addition to Chatham Collegiate, the team will meet Western Reserve Academy, Nichols School of Buffalo, University School of Cleveland and Shady Side Academy of Pittsburgh. It is a tough season beginning Oct. 11 with Lake Forest and continuing with Western Reserve Academy, Nichols School of Buffalo, University School of Cleveland and Shady Side Academy of Pittsburgh and Detroit University School at Grosse Pointe. After the Birmingham meet on Oct. 17, they will meet Hazel Park on the 24th and go to Lincoln Park on Nov. 1, ending the season as hosts to the Plymouth High School cross-country team.
