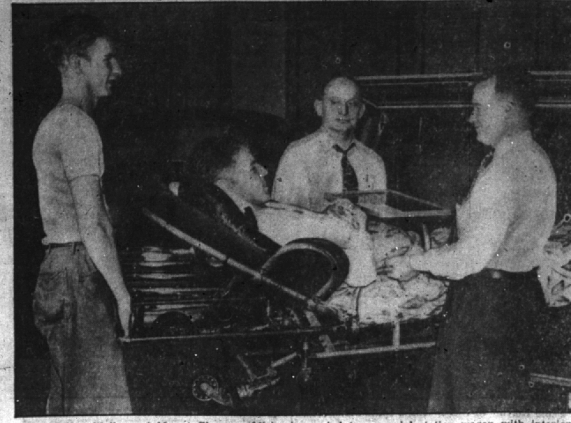


### Hopes Pilgrimage Will Cure 23 Years of Paralysis

### Invite Birmingham Golfers to Enter Amateur Tourney

Birmingham golfers have been invited to compete in the Metropolitan Golf Association's open amateur public links championship for the Mayor Edward J. Jeffries, Jr. trophy to be held at Sylvan Glen Golf Club on Rochester Road, Monday and Tuesday, September 15 and 16. The tournament will consist of 72 holes of medal play with 36 holes being played on each day, according to Bill Catto, host pro, of Sylvan Glen.

Catto said that entries are still being accepted, but will be closed after the first 124 players have registered. Regardless of the number of entries the list will be closed Saturday noon, September 6. The fee is six dollars and should be mailed with an entry blank, which can be obtained at any MGA or Municipal course, to Edward A. Atlas, 1006 Washington Boulevard Building, Detroit 26.

Besides the Jeffries trophy, 20 other prizes will be given and an added feature of the tournament, four-man teams may be entered to compete for the Bob Southland Trophy which will be determined by the team's aggregate score over the first 36 holes of the regular tournament.

Catto said there would be no admission charge for spectators. The public is invited to watch the golfers and may use the club house facilities at any time. The course is in fine shape for this event, he added.

### Beginnings of Indian Art Are Now on Display

A temporary exhibit, "Man Becomes an Artist" will be on display at the Cranbrook Institute of Science, Bloomfield Hills, during the month of September.

The display, prepared by the Laboratory of Anthropology, Santa Fe, consists of 24 panels executed by three outstanding Santa Fe artists and depicts the growth of art forms among the Indians of the Southwest.

The famous Folsom point, earliest evidence in the new world of man's aesthetic ambitions, is incorporated into one of the panels in replica. The theme progresses through the centuries to suggestions for our own use of these genuine American designs in modern decorative schemes.

In addition to the panels by Hilaire Hiler, Louis Ewing and the Navajo artist, Quincy Tahoma, examples from the collections of Fred Dockstader and from the collection of the Institute are also shown.
