The second National Wild-Flower Photographic Salon, sponsored by the Michigan Academy of Native Plant Protection, opens today at the Cranbrook Institute of Science. The judges' selection of prints are on display and may be seen from two to five p.m., through Sunday, April 4.

The prizing mantle, weird insect occasionally found in southern Michigan gardens, is the subject of an exhibition to be held through April at the Cranbrook Institute of Science. All pictures are by Edith F. Johnston of Bronxville, N. Y., and have been reproduced in her book for children, "Strange Visitors".

The female mantis is a large green insect, deliberate in stalking its prey but lightning quick in movement at the strike. It has an odd, unobscure-like manner of following a person's movements by swiveling its triangular head. The mantis is a blessing in the garden because it eats great quantities of harmful insects.
