Mrs. Reynolds Is Garden Club Guest

"Evergreens and their Care" was the subject on which Mrs. Perry Reynolds of Detroit spoke to the Birmingham Branch of the Woman's National Farm and Garden Association at their meeting last week.

Mrs. Reynolds stressed several important points. "First, one must be very careful in the selection of evergreens," she said. "Go to a good reliable nurseryman. Early spring planting is most desirable. Water twice weekly during the first year if planted in heavy soil and three times weekly if planted in sandy soil.

"The best fertilizer to use for evergreens is 10-6-4. Use before March 15 and again June 15th. Work well in the soil. About April 20th, or after the sap flows, you may start pruning. Cut for balance and symmetry. Shear them where you want them to grow."

Miss Cooke, head librarian in Birmingham for 13 years, was active in the League of Women Voters and the AAUW.


