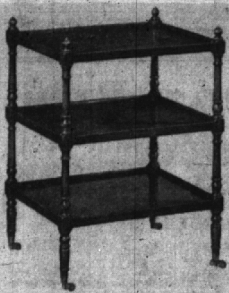

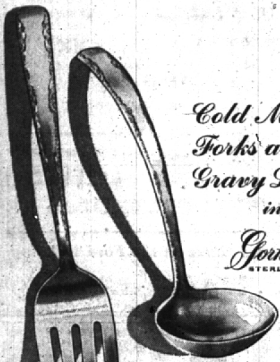

Panel Discussion on Child-Parent Relations Held

John Hammond opened the old fashioned "Town Meeting" of the Quarten PTA Tuesday evening, April 13, in the school gym by singing a large ball such as the Town Officers once used. Charles Dybig, father vice-president for the next year, acted as moderator for a panel discussion on the topic of "Can Leadership and Character in Our Children be Developed by Following the Crowd?"

Mrs. C. Campbell gave a mother's view of the question and stressed the need for a child's security through reason and discipline. Dr. H. C. Waiser presented a psychosomatic viewpoint and urged that parents realize the need for security and love in their children. Mrs. Loughran spoke for the teachers and asked parents to adopt reasonable standards and help their children make normal adjustments.

EM Barth, secretary of the YMCA, presented the spiritual side of the question and explained that in order to attain individuality, the child must be taught self discipline and self respect. Kirby, in order to be consulted on the subject, the child must be reached by mixing every day and spiritual life together. Also, children should be consulted on decisions regarding their problems and so find a mutual esteem in the parent-child relationship.

After the meeting, an open forum was held and the audience was encouraged to ask questions and make suggestions. Mrs. Richard K'burg, president of the Quarten PTA, presided at the meeting.
