Newcomers' Club Adopts St. Malo, A War Devastated Town in Brittany

Last Thursday 75 newcomers attended the monthly luncheon meeting at the Community House and were entertained by the Drama Group of the AAUW which presented "The Ever Happens Here", which was adapted for an all feminine cast. The performance brought hearty applause.

The business meeting followed. A resolution was made and unanimously carried that the Newcomers' Club support the adoption of St. Malo, as has been proposed by the Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Because a Canadian city proposed to adopt this sea-coast town of Brittany, St. Malo was excluded from the aid program of UNRA. Canadian plans did not mature. St. Malo, the scene of a double devastation has been unable to rebuild and food and clothing are very scarce.

Here the Germans held out and their Patton's Third Army bombarded, and burned before breaking through. Behind its medieval fortifications the ever-trenched themselves so that the very fortress-like nature of the town proved its doing. American military might was forced to demolish and destroy.

It is therefore with a feeling of restitution as well as generosity. Mrs. Hatch, the club president, pointed out, that the Newcomers are the adoption of St. Malo with older residents of Birmingham.

Mrs. Lidzowski, who once lived in St. Malo, gave the newcomers a vivid picture of the town surrounded by high walls wide enough for motoring, with no real industry but tourists who used to come before the war to watch the little fishing boats and admire the art and beauty of the old town populated with costumed peasants and red pom-pomed sailor boys. A direct line from Southampton brought people from England.
