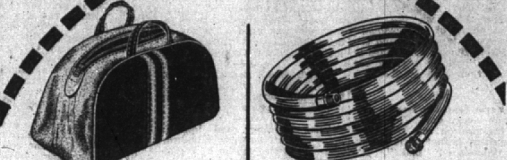

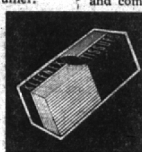

BRIDGE AT THE COMMUNITY HOUSE

(A report on the duplicate bridge tournament held every Wednesday afternoon at 7:45 o'clock. You and your partner are cordially invited to participate.)

I sing a song of myself—and Dave Stuart, a very good partner. On the evening of April 21, with eleven and a half tables in play, Dave and I took first honors in the north and south position. (Did I hear someone say, "It's about time?") Ruth Hull and Charles Thimer were second, and Mrs. N. Hadley and Mrs. G. Nelson, third.

In the east and west position, Mr. and Mrs. A. L. Rogge won, with Mr. and Mrs. Jack Dargendorf second, and Mrs. E. L. Guy and Myrtle Remmel third.

The north and south players in the April 21 tournament had a rare opportunity to test their ability to handle powerful hands. The strength ran north and south all evening. "Game" bids were commonplace. And slam opportunities occurred with astonishing frequency. I gave you a board which raised many arguments pro and con.

South was the dealer. The auction was monopolized by North and South. Some timid teams played for a part score in diamonds or hearts. Only one team, Milquetoasts stopped at a game bid in hearts. The courageous few bid six hearts. No team went for seven. Nor did any team make seven. And with West opening a spade (which he did in 100 per cent of seven hearts appears possible. But it isn't.

All south players were gratified at the opening lead since it presented them with an extra spade trick. The play from that point was stereotyped.

Three rounds of hearts were played, stripping East to one. A diamond was then led to the king in dummy, East ruffing. East returned the club king. South discarded his losing small spade and took the trick with dummy's ace. The ace of diamonds was cashed.

At the eighth trick, those declarers who took the trouble to count the diamond suit realized that West could stop it. So they entered the closed hand by using a club and cashed the two top diamonds and the top spade. This left two trump tricks in dummy for the last two tricks. Those who failed to count diamonds led a heart at trick eight and wound up with only five-odd.

Arguments developed over the question of what could be done with any other opening lead. I stand with the school that believes that a slam would be impossible at that case unless the defenders made an error.
