A record tying performance was staged for Maple fans at the River Rouge invitational track meet by Rollie McGinnis who soared 11 feet in the pole vault to tie a five-year-old indoor record set by Fred Zoellin in 1943.

Two former Maple trackmen helped officiate the River Rouge meet. Bill Wycoff, hurdler, acted as scorer, while Herb Quinn, sprinter on last year's team, was one of the meet marshals.

Although successful in the first meet, the Maple track team has been hampered by injuries to several key men. Dale Pearson, shot-putter, suffered an arm injury that limited his effectiveness, while Don Wilson, one of last year's lettermen, is completely disabled due to a sprained ankle. Jim Anderson, star high jumper, is competing despite an irritating back sprain. All these boys should improve when their injuries are healed.

Another former Birmingham athlete has made the grade. This time it is John Anderson, who attends Alma College, who is second man on the golf team though only a freshman. Winning letters in football, baseball and golf while attending Baldwin, John may repeat that feat in college.

Though Birmingham turns out many good athletes, few take up coaching as a career. An exception is Rollie Langerman, Walled Lake's basketball and track coach. When competing for Birmingham, Rollie established himself as one of the four highest basketball scorers in history. In track he was a pole vaulter.
