Soroptimist Club Hears Comparison of Business World

Members of the Soroptimist Club of Birmingham were briefed in modern methods of industrial engineering and personnel relations last Thursday evening when Edwin Squier and Howard K. Meyers, discussed the subjects at a dinner meeting at the home of the President Mrs. Evan H. Wright, 17560 Avilla road, Beverly Hills.

Squier and Myers, who are on the staff of Hall and Lilies, management consultants now engaged in making a survey for the City of Birmingham, outlined the technique of first modernizing a business, or plant, with respect to equipment, working conditions and wage adjustments.

It was pointed out, however, that the ultimate success of any organization depends also upon a complete understanding on the part of both management and labor, of the aims and responsibilities of other departments, and of setting up a proper line of communication, both from the top to the bottom and from the bottom to the top of the concern.

Then and Now

A comparison was made of working conditions in a large Chicago Department store during the year 1860 with the generally accepted standards of today's modern business. This pointed up the tremendous improvements which have been made in bringing about (through intelligent application of modern methods of operating and an analysis of the type of personnel required for each job) the streamlined and efficient organization which is possible only when all irritations and difficulties are brought out into the open and solved with skill and understanding.

Careful selection of employees who are inspired by the security of knowing that management is truly interested in developing a cooperative organization can eliminate most of the common problems in industry and business today.
