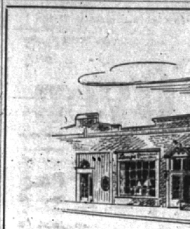

Another group is made up of prints by Harry Bertola, former student and teacher at the Academy of Art who has become known for his colored prints. Of both artistic and historical interest are the colored lithographs of the Mayan ruins by Frederick Catherwood, one of the 19th century discoverers of the Mayan cities of Central America.

For the current exhibitions the Museum has also put on display American paintings from the Museum's permanent collection. Among these are oil paintings and water colors by such notable American artists as John Martin, Aaron Bohrod, Louis Boche, Isabel Bishop, Joe Jones and Doris Lee.
