Class "C" (ages 10-11)—John Appleford won the 50 yard dash in 7.2 seconds; Mike Hartwood, 50 yard low hurdles in 8.5 seconds; Jack Kelly won the broad jump with a distance of 12 feet; shot put, Jete Kass, 16 feet 7 1/2 inches; high jump, Don Yates, 4 feet 2 inches; pole vault, Mickey Hartwood, 5 feet 6 inches.

Class "B" (ages 12-13)—The 50 yard dash was won by Jimmie Barnard in 7 seconds; Bob Appleford won the 75 yard dash in 10.4 seconds, the 50 yard low hurdles in 8 seconds, and jumped 13 feet 9 inches to win the broad jump; shot put was taken by John Lutz with a distance of 32 feet 8 inches; high jump was won by Mickey Plumstead at 4 feet 6 inches; Thompson Tiarada won the pole vault in 6 feet 6 inches.

Class "A" (ages 14-15)—Chuck Tyson won the 50 yard dash in 6 seconds and the 100 yard dash in 11.2 seconds; the 110 yard low hurdles was taken by Joe Bachman in 14.7 seconds; broad jump, Art Fairbanks, at 17 feet 10 inches; shot put, Ed Herron, 46 feet, 1 1/2 inches; high jump, Art Fairbanks, 5 feet 4 inches; pole vault, Don Halpin, 8 feet.

Open Class
"Open" class (ages 16 and over)—The 100 yard dash was won by Dick Murray in 10.5 seconds; 110 yard high hurdles, Carl Bryant, 13.2 seconds; 600 yard run, Mike Flannery, 1 minute 11.4 seconds; 1500 yard run, Bill Highman, 4 minutes 18.6 seconds; broad jump, Dick Minor, 20 feet 4 inches; shot put, Bud Gasser, 48 feet 11 inches; high jump, Stan Schaefer, 5 feet 8 inches; pole vault, Stan Hopkinson and Bud Carter tied with a distance of 10 feet.

Rain Stops Just in Time to Permit Running of Annual Junior Olympics

Despite rain which continued right up until shortly before the first event, the fourth annual Birmingham Junior Olympic Games were held last Wednesday, August 11, at Pierce Field as a twilight meet starting at 7 o'clock.

The games, annually sponsored and run by the Side Line Quarterbacks, were this year part of a part of the summer recreation program of the Birmingham Recreation Board rather than during the school year.

Judging from the number of adult spectators and participants in the various events in spite of the threatening weather, the meet was considered highly successful. Some 150 boys and young men displayed their track skill in an attempt to cop the 102 ribbons and four trophies that were awarded.

Ribbons Are Awarded
Some excellent records were hung up on future games should at even though the meet was held rather late in the summer when condition of the athletes was not the best. Handsome ribbons were awarded to the first four places in each event, and a beautiful track trophy was awarded to the outstanding track athlete in each age class.

The Side Line Quarterbacks plan next year to hold the games directly after school is finished for the summer, thus giving those boys who go away to camps an opportunity to participate before going away. The high school and college men would also be in much better condition directly after school recess for the summer. Some added events are also being contemplated.

Winners of the four Quarterback trophies were as follows: in class "C", the 10-11 age group, Don Yates won with a mighty high jump of 4 feet 2 inches which was higher than he was tall. In class "B", the 12-13 age group, another high jumper, Mickey Plumstead won the trophy with a jump of 4 feet 6 inches.

Excellent Distances

In class "A", the 14-15 age group, Art Fairbanks won the trophy with a broad jump of 17 feet 10 inches which is an excellent distance for this age. In the "open" class, age 16 and over, Mike Flannery sped across the field in 1 minute 17.4 seconds in the 600 yard run to cop the trophy in this class.

Class "A" (ages 14-15)—Chuck Tyson won the 50 yard dash in 6 seconds and the 100 yard dash in 11.2 seconds; the 110 yard low hurdles was taken by Joe Bachman in 14.7 seconds; broad jump, Art Fairbanks, at 17 feet 10 inches; shot put, Ed Herron, 46 feet, 1 1/2 inches; high jump, Art Fairbanks, 5 feet 4 inches; pole vault, Don Halpin, 8 feet.

Open Class
"Open" class (ages 16 and over)—The 100 yard dash was won by Dick Murray in 10.5 seconds; 110 yard high hurdles, Carl Bryant, 13.2 seconds; 600 yard run, Mike Flannery, 1 minute 11.4 seconds; 1500 yard run, Bill Highman, 4 minutes 18.6 seconds; broad jump, Dick Minor, 20 feet 4 inches; shot put, Bud Gasser, 48 feet 11 inches; high jump, Stan Schaefer, 5 feet 8 inches; pole vault, Stan Hopkinson and Bud Carter tied with a distance of 10 feet.
