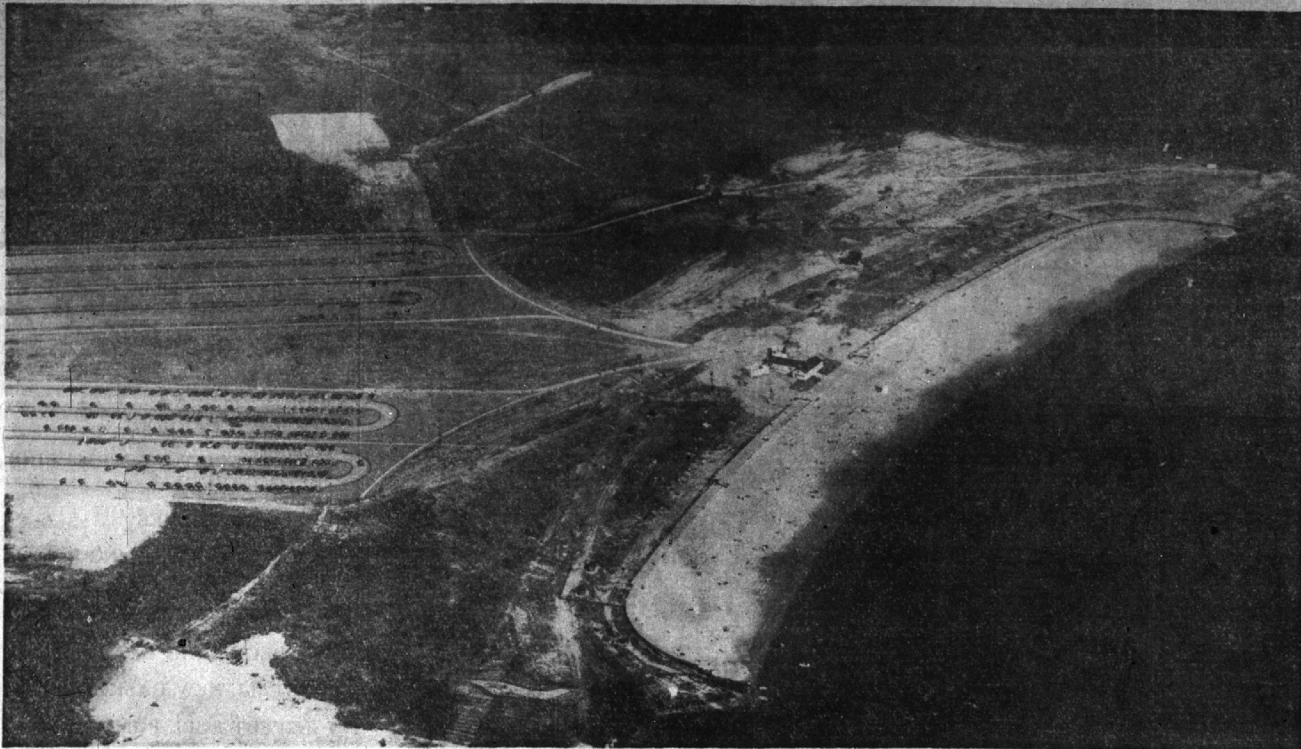


State's Largest Inland Beach Only A Few Miles From Here



Lovely 1,600-Ft. White Sand Strip On Pontiac Lake

Are you tired of bucking the thousands of Detroiters who drive out to Oakland county lakes and "take over" the swimming facilities?

Do you long for a family swimming spot where you don't have to use a magnifying glass to locate the beach or the water on a nice swimming day?

Well, there is just such a beach—but how long it will be before it is discovered and continually used by Detroiters is a subject of conjecture. But it will probably not be until sometime next summer before this happens. So it would be wise for Birmingham area residents—those not fortunate enough to enjoy country club swimming privileges—to take advantage of it for the rest of this summer, at least.

15 Mile from Here

The spot being referred to is a new 1,600-ft. white sand beach on Pontiac lake, seven miles west of Birmingham and about 15 miles from Birmingham. Recently opened by the State Conservation Department, facilities include a spacious parking lot, a temporary bath house for changing clothes, and life guards.

Slope of the bathing beach is ideal for family use. At about 150 feet from shore the water is only three feet deep, while at 300 feet it is only five feet in depth.

The pure white sand used for the beach was pumped from the bottom of the lake. Although still a little soft, it is hardening with use.

Winker Sports, too

The conservation department intends to develop this area for winter sports, too. These will include toboggan slides and facilities for skating.

Perhaps one of the reasons why this new beach—the largest inland bathing beach in Michigan—is not used more by the public is that the conservation department hasn't gotten around to properly marking the location with directional signs. When this is done—not before the next summer in all probability—the beach will be packed on warm nights and on sultry weekends.

In the meantime, there's lots and lots of room for bathers this fall. Still, ample time for Birmingham area residents to enjoy its facilities before they get to look like Coney Island.

From the air, it can be clearly seen how extensive are the recently opened bathing beach and facilities at Pontiac Lake. Although the photograph shows several hundred persons using the beach, it does not appear crowded, for

it is designed to accommodate 2,500 people. To the left can be seen the huge parking area, with foot-paths converging on the temporary bathhouse. Best way for Birmingham-Bloomfield residents to get to

the new park is to go west to Telegraph road, then follow it north to Huron street in Pontiac. Turn left on Huron street to the little roadside park about a mile west of the Pontiac airport. Turn right onto Williams lake road for a
