Blauman Pitches Three-Hitter to Keep B'ham Chrysler's Playoff Hopes Alive

Dick Blauman regained his control and pitched a three hitter, giving the Birmingham Chrysler's their second playoff victory over McCatty Construction, 4-3. The big right-hander fanned 18 while giving up nine free passes to first.

Lil Cobb pitched nine ball for McCatty, but his support was lacking. He gave up only seven hits and no earned runs. Cobb, a southpaw, fanned nine while passing only two.

The Chrysler's jumped off to a one run lead in the first half of the first inning. Dick Costigan walked, but was forced at second by Jim Ferns. Bill Eade singled to left and John Kalmanek forced him no earned runs. Cobb, a southpaw, fanned nine while passing only two.

Another Fumble
The Chrysler's pushed another run across in the second. Conway Adams was safe when Teasley fumbled his grounder and went to third on Tom Witt's double down the right field line. Adams scored after Blauman's fly to right, but Costigan failed to score also.

McCatty got their first score in the fourth. Cobb led off an untimely home run on Blauman's third strike pitch but too much on it for Eade to handle. Cobb went to second on a wild pitch, stole third, and came home on an infield grounder.

The last two Chrysler rallies scored in the seventh. Witt singled to right and took second on a passed ball. Cobb threw Blauman a sacrifice bunt past first. Blauman reaching second and Witt third. Costigan fanned and Ferns popped to third, but Eade came through with a single to center; both runs scoring. Kalmanek fanned, ending the inning.

Three Errors in Seventh
Three errors netted McCatty another run in the seventh. Teasley reached first when Witt fumbled his grounder, when to third John Kalmanek let go of Chojnowski's grounder go through him, and

came home when Witt fumbled his second-grounder of the frame. The last McCatty tally was a result of a last ditch try in the ninth. Bill Hane fanned, but Cobb walked and stole second. He came home on Teasley's single to center. Blauman promptly settled down and struck out Ed Wojie and Ed Wojie struck out Tom Witt to Ferns at short, ending the ball game.

Blauman, although he was fairly wild due to lack of work, pitched his best ball in the clutch as is evidenced by 12 McCatty runners left stranded. This was one of his best ball games as he paced himself so as to have enough stuff left to halt the ninth inning threat.
