**Local Kiwanians
Lend Assistance
to Nat'l Project**

More than 9,000,000 patriotic pamphlets, based on a wide variety of subjects and designed to show that "It's Fun to Live in America," have been distributed by Kiwanis clubs from coast to coast since the first of the year.

This announcement was made

today by Ernie Miller, president of the Kiwanis Club of Birmingham, who said the purpose of the pamphlet campaign is to stress the importance of maintaining the individual enterprise system in the United States.

Dramatic Comparisons

Each of the seven pamphlets that have been issued up to this time have made dramatic comparisons between America's form of government and the totalitarian theory of centralized control of business, industry, agriculture, the church, home and school, Miller stated.

Kiwanians throughout the nation are using the pamphlets as inserts with payroll envelopes, statements, circulars, and other correspondence. When this phase of the campaign comes to a conclusion in December, it is estimated that nearly 15,000,000 leaflets will have been circulated.

The Kiwanis program has won the endorsement of leaders in business, industry, education and government. A number of plant publications are reproducing the various pamphlets and countless thousands have been distributed to school children with the thought in mind that "teen-agers" must realize the opportunities that prevail in America.

One of Year's Objectives

Miller said the program was inspired by Kiwanis International's 1948 administrative theme, "Citizenship Responsibility—the Price of Freedom," and one of this year's objectives which calls upon clubs to "Develop an informed public opinion to combat all ideologies opposed to the democratic principles upon which our nation are founded."

The program is being directed by the service organization's International Committee on Public Affairs for the United States.
