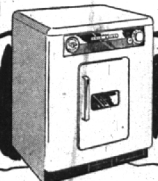

Three Michigan county agricultural agents were given distinguished service awards at the recent annual meeting of the National Association of County Agricultural Agents in Chicago. They were Karl D. Bailey, Oakland county; Leo Bailey, Ottawa county and Arthur Glidden, Grand Traverse county.

Bailey, who is acting president of the Michigan association of County Agricultural Agents, has been a resident of highly populated Oakland county since 1931. Born on a South Dakota farm, Bailey was graduated from Michigan State college in agriculture in 1921. He taught vocational agriculture at Holly, for ten years before joining the Michigan Extension Service.

He has made effective use of the press and radio to carry a diversified program in home gardening, orcharding, dairying and 4-H Club work. He has built up an outstanding youth program in the highly industrial areas around Pontiac and Detroit. More than 2,000 boys and girls are enrolled in 4-H Club work in the county this year.

Sight, Hearing Tests Are Completed Here

Last week saw the completion of the sight and hearing tests which have been conducted throughout the entire Birmingham school system.

The work was done through volunteer efforts of mothers of the pupils in the various schools. Miss Frances Curtin, school nurse, was in charge of the program.

The work has brought to the attention of parents and teachers any sight and hearing defects among pupils. Corrective measures have been taken to correct the ailment in most cases. It has been found that many children suffered during class work through poor sight or poor hearing.

The correction of this has brought many thought to be inferior to fellow-students, up to the class average. Schools throughout the county which have used these tests, according to Miss Curtin, have restored a sense of security in children who had previously been unable to keep up with their classmates.
