At least one hospital is needed in this vicinity, and we should attempt to obtain it as soon as possible. The Greater Detroit Hospital Fund seems to give us way to get it.

Rate Boost some in additional rates should come as no surprise to the company's customers. Earlier this year Bell asked for more than \$10,000,000 to help out the company's financial position, but the Michigan Public Service Commission shaved that request by about \$2,000,000. We can't complain as long as we still get the correct number. The MPSC, the citizens' watchdog in matters affecting public utilities, will see we get no "paded" increase in rates.
