The couple is planning a March 19 wedding.

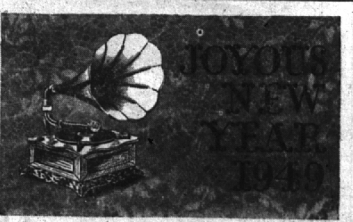
