Birmingham alumnae of the University of Michigan are invited to attend a luncheon meeting in the Michigan League Building Monday, Feb. 16, at 12:15 p.m., to hear the Dowager Marchioness of Reading from London, England.

Lady Reading's visit to Ann Arbor is sponsored by the Alumnae Council. Her tour was arranged to include three American universities so she can take back to Great Britain a first hand report of American higher education.

At present a member of the Overseas Settlement and vice chairman of the British Broadcasting Company, Lady Reading directed a million British women in Women's Voluntary Services throughout the war. She was made Dame of the British Empire in 1941 by the King for her services to the country and in 1941 was raised to the highest rank in the Order, Dame Grand Cross of which there are only seventy-five men and women.
