

Baldwin Reserves Win Cage Game Last Friday Night

In a rugged, fiercely contested game, the Maple reserve cagers came from behind and then stood off a last quarter rally to down East Detroit's Shamrocks 28-30 last Friday on the Shamrock's floor.

After a slow start, the Maples poured in 13 points in their usual brilliant second quarter spree while limiting the Shamrocks to a single basket to roll up a 23-12 halftime lead. The Maples then withstood the East Detroiters' accurate long shooting attack to come out on the long end of the score.

Playing his last game for the Maples, Pete Terres led the victors with 11 points. Graduating with the January class, Terres has been one of the key players on the Maroon squad and is the highest scorer on the team, with a total of 46 points for but half the season.

Taking an early lead and holding onto it, the Birmingham cagers won a hard-fought league battle with East Detroit, 41-34, on the latter's floor Friday night.

In the beginning, the contest looked like an easy victory for the Maples. With their offense clicking perfectly, the Maples went far ahead; but East Detroit came back hard, relying mainly on long shots by Captain Guido Merasco to bring the half-time score to 21-18 in favor of Birmingham.

During the entire second half the Maples tried but eight shots, making good on four of them. However, they capitalized on 12 foul shots to stop a comeback by the Shamrocks.

Bob Folin topped all the scorers with 14 tallies to his credit. Merasco had 12 markers chalked up for the Shamrocks when he was banished for the fifth foul.

This was the last game under Birmingham colors for Norm Goddard, tall center who was graduated at the mid-year exercises.
