Musical Program Is To Feature Local Artists

Plans are being completed for the benefit concert, which the Birmingham Musicians will sponsor at the Community House on Monday, Jan. 26. All proceeds will go to the benefit of the Community House fund drive.

The program will feature the work of two well-known young musicians, Stanley Lock, Detroit pianist, and Charles Ross Turner, Birmingham violinist.

Lock is called one of the country's outstanding young pianists, a native of Detroit. He studied there, with Edward Brechtel, and five appearances with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, launched his musical career in his home city.

Stanley Lock is a product of Michigan musical circles. He obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of Michigan and is widely known in musical circles throughout the state. He had made several appearances on Birmingham Musicians programs prior to his current engagement.

At present he is making personal appearances in the West, where he is also a member of the Julliard School of Music faculty, in New York.

Miss Scholarship Charles Turner began his study of the violin at the age of seven. His first teacher was Harry McHenry of the Arthur Jordan Conservatory of Indianapolis. After five years with McHenry, the family moved to Birmingham, where the lad continued his lessons under the tutelage of William Grading King in Detroit. Nine years later he won a scholarship at the Curtis Institute in Philadelphia, where he studied under Madame Lea Lubshutz.

Studying during the summer at the Julliard School of Music, Edward Dethner was his instructor.

He received his Bachelor of Music degree at the Detroit Institute of Musical Arts.

The war interrupted his musical career when he entered the Navy, and it was not until his release, in 1946, that he again took up the study of the violin. He enrolled again at Julliard, and received his Bachelor of Science degree from that school last year.

At the time of his release from military duty he was serving in the South Pacific as navigator. He studied in the School of Oriental Languages at Colorado University, and later at Oklahoma A. & M.
