Teachers Plan to Attend Meeting at Rackham Bldg.

Teachers and administrators from public schools in the six counties of Wayne, Washtenaw, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe, and St. Clair will gather at the Rackham building in Detroit, Jan. 12, in afternoon and evening sessions at 2 P. M. and 7:30 P. M., to take part in a conference on the evaluation of teachers' services. It was announced this week by Dr. H. L. Shihler, superintendent of schools, Highland Park, and chairman of the Committee on Teacher Evaluation of the Metropolitan Detroit Bureau of Cooperative School Studies.

Participating as speakers will be Dean J. B. Edmonson, School of Education, University of Michigan, who will discuss the growing professional status of the school staff; Dr. John H. Rappaport, industrial psychologist, U. S. Rubber Company, who will discuss developments in industry in the use of merit rating of supervisors and other white collar workers, with emphasis upon those aspects of industry's experience that are meaningful to teachers and administrators; Mr. David H. Patton, superintendent of schools, Syracuse, New York, and chairman, New York State Committee on Teacher Evaluation, which committee is attempting to implement the recent New York state law requiring teacher ratings. Mr. Patton will describe and appraise the work being done in New York state toward most effectuating a workable system of evaluation.

Dean Waldo E. Lessinger, College of Education, Wayne University, will chairmen a panel which will discuss some of the problems faced by local districts in the further consideration of teacher evaluation. Panel members, in addition to those mentioned above, will be Dr. Cyril Woolcock, Superintendent of schools, Royal Oak; Mr. Walter Clemenson, high school principal, Grosse Pointe; and three teachers, one each from Detroit, Birmingham, and Wyandotte.

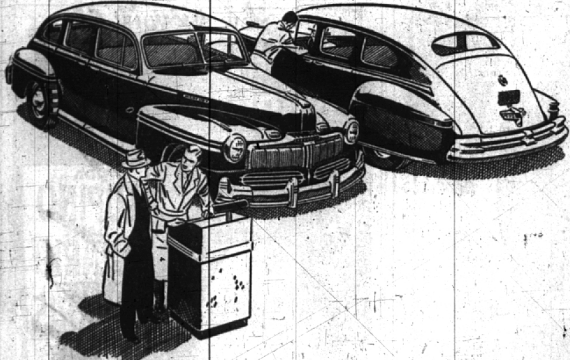

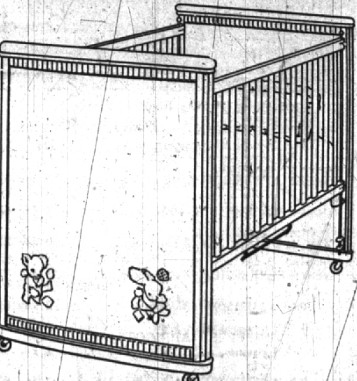
