**Dr. Maloney to Address AAUW on Care of Children**

Dr. James Clark Maloney, president of the Michigan Society of Neurology and Psychology will be the featured speaker when the AAUW Child Study Club meets tonight at 8 o'clock. He will speak on the Corneilison Corner meeting in the United States and will show motion pictures taken in Okinawa to carry out observations of the relation between infant care and adult nervous. All parents and prospective parents are invited to attend this lecture.

The Cornelian Corner, organized in Detroit five years ago by Dr. Maloney and a few others, is described as "an organization of specialists in the fields of pediatrics, obstetrics, psychiatry, child development, or a professionally allied group interested in the purpose of the organization, or any person actively engaged in any recognized social enterprise".

**Urges Affection and Love**  
The group encourages mothers to keep their children with them at every possible moment, from birth on to adolescence. It urges that affection and loving care be lavished on the child at all times, and that at the beginning, his every wish be granted, in order that he may develop with a sense of deep affection, complete security, and no sense of fear or neglect be allowed to touch him.

In Okinawa, where Dr. Maloney served during the war, this was the case. At the least sign of tension, nervousness or fretfulness babies are fed by the mothers, he said. This calms them, gives them attention, and makes them feel secure. The organization believes, sincerely, that this results in better adults. They know no period of doubt, as children. Their nerves have not become taut and strained, and they grow into normal, happy youngsters, well on the road to being normal, happy adults, it is claimed.

At Okinawa, Dr. Maloney was placed in charge of psychiatric hospitals there, had a chance to make a first-hand study of the situation, and was deeply impressed by the minimum of psychosomatic diseases.

**Treated Like Human**  
During their stay, these American surgeons and physicians encountered no cases of shock reactions; fainting spells were not known; peptic ulcer, asthma, allergies, diabetes and arthritis were almost unheard of. There were no cases of angina pectoris or coronary heart disease.

A great deal of this has been credited to the fact that the Okinawan mother is never separated from her child. The baby is fondled and offered food at the slightest sign of disturbance of any kind and is never subjected to corporal punishment. The baby is treated like a human being who, during the first few months, has more rights and privileges than an adult. The emotional stability of the adult Okinawan is believed to be directly dependent on this.
