**Walmoth Defeats McIntire to Win Jr. Tennis Title**

Raymond Walmoth defeated Keith McIntire 3-2, 3-6, 6-4, 6-1, 6-3, to win the junior title of the Birmingham Center Tournament held at the Kingswood courts June 23-26.

McIntire took an early lead and in complete command until the middle of the third set. At this point Walmoth's steady driving game won McIntire down and Walmoth took the final three sets and the match. McIntire displayed a terrific cannon-ball serve and a hard overhead smash throughout the game.

The quarter-final round saw Walmoth defeat Roger Beebe 6-2, 6-0; Howard Trier won over George Bosworth 6-0, 6-2; Phil Savage defeated John Kling 6-3, 6-1, and McIntire downed Bill Buel 6-0, 6-0.

 Beebe won the boys title by defeating Bosworth, 6-2, 10-8. Bosworth gave Beebe a tough time in the second set, but Beebe, with the score at 8-11, put on a blast of hard drives to win the championship. In the semi-finals Beebe defeated Jerry Schram 6-1, 6-0 and Bosworth dropped Dave Millard 6-1, 6-0.

The junior doubles title was taken by McIntire and Phil Savage. They won over Walmoth and Kling 6-4, 6-2, 6-1, 6-3. In the semi-finals Walmoth and Kling beat Beebe and Bosworth 6-0, 6-2 and McIntire and Savage dropped Trier and Thoms 6-0, 6-1.
