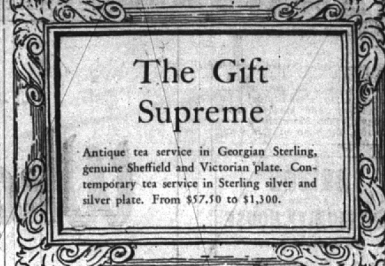
A graduate of Kingswood School and Wellesley College, Miss Grindley is also a provisional member of the Detroit Junior League.

No date has been set for the wedding.

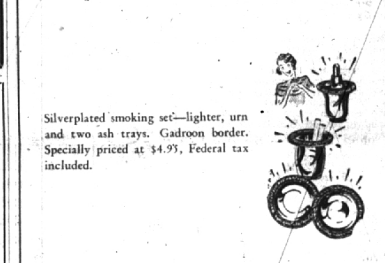
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
