Red Cross Has Nutrition, Water Safety Programs

Mrs. L. L. Northrup of Birmingham, chairman of nutrition for the Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, announces that the nutrition program of the chapter is continuing during the summer months. This special work is carried on in the Oakland Gardens Federal Housing project at Eight Mile road and in the Crystal Beach project in Pontiac.

The chapter is participating in the V.N.A. clinic in Oakland Gardens by furnishing a nutrition worker one day a week. A chef school is also in progress in which school boys and girls are learning elementary nutrition principles combined with their practical application. At the Crystal Beach home visits are being made in the interest of the nutrition program.

Water Safety Program
An average of 650 individuals a day are participating in the summer water safety program of the Oakland County chapter according to Mark Smith, of Birmingham, chairman of this service in the chapter. Two water safety instructors, authorized by the American National Red Cross, are directing the program and are assisted by one water safety instructor and four senior life savers.

The program is conducted at 22 beaches and pools in the county which classes are held once a week for eight weeks. The instruction is directed toward the conservation of human life. Oakland County with its numerous lakes is the scene of many water accidents, particularly during the hot months. The knowledge of one's own safety in the water many times prevents near-drowning or actual drownings.

Instruction is based on graded courses, for completion of which certificates are issued. The current season marks the tenth year that the local chapter has offered the program to the public entirely free of charge.

The chapter also, Smith states, has completed two senior life saving classes in which individuals were awarded certificates. Many of these class members are now using their skill on public beaches in the camps. The classes were taught by Smith and Mrs. William Isaacson. Smith recently served as a member of the national staff at a Red Cross aquatic school.
