Pine Lake Annual Regatta to Have Colorful Events

Everything from a men's tilting contest and a rowboat race to a half mile sailing competition is scheduled for the annual regatta at Pine Lake. The event will start at 2:00 p.m. from the Pine Lake Country Club dock on Sunday, Aug. 8. The affair is being sponsored by the Interlaken Association.

Entries may be made at race times and all events are open to residents of Pine Lake, their guests and all members of the Pine Lake Country Club and their guests.

Besides high board diving and water skiing exhibitions, there will be a two mile course sailboat race; an eight mile course stock inboard runabout race (closed); a four mile course stock outboard runabout race (unlimited H. P.); and a two mile course stock outboard runabout race (under 10 H. P.).

Many Other Events

In swimming events there will be a 20 yard competition for boys under ten; a 20 yard for girls under ten; a 40 yard swim for boys from 10-15; a 40 yard swim for girls from 10-15; a 40 yard race

for boys over 15 and for girls over 15. There will also be a men's half mile swimming race.

In the diving events there is a scheduled three dives for boys under 16 as well as for girls under 16; six dives for boys over 16 and also for girls over 16.

To add to the program, single canoe races of 100 yards for boys and one for girls under 16 are to be held as well as the same for boys and girls over 16 in a 200 yard competition. There will also be a 200 yard men's double canoe race and a ladies' double canoe race of the same distance.

Boys and girls under 16 will compete in a single gunwale canoe race for 50 yards and boys and girls under 16 are to pit their energies in a 100 yard rowboat race.

Completing the day's festivities will be a canoe filling contest plus a men's tilting event. There will be prizes for the winners in all events.

Non-members of the Pine Lake Country Club are invited to view the races from boats on the lake surface.
