This week the F. J. Mulholland Company is celebrating its 25th anniversary in Birmingham. Founded by the late Frank J. Mulholland in 1923, since that time it has maintained a position as one of Birmingham's outstanding stores. Frank J. Mulholland died in 1937, but the store remains as a tribute to the successful business practices he instituted. It is still owned by the Mulholland family, members of which are active in its operation.

The firm was first located next to the old First State Bank, now the Wilson Drug Company, and later was in one of the buildings occupied by the Krage Company. The store was moved to its present quarters in 1928.

and honesty would permit it was at that time that Gene Black first revealed his attitude of "personalizing" his criticism. You see it now in his feud with Sigler; before this campaign is finished, you probably will see it revealed against others.

As a fairly close friend of Gene's, I have, and do now, regret his failure to name more objective in his criticisms; but that is, of course, his own affair.

While I have never claimed that the Sigler Administration, (or any other, for that matter), achieved every goal it originally planned for itself, I do hold that the Sigler regime has made some outstanding contributions to the improvement and reform in State government. I regret that Mr. Black in his criticism of the Sigler Administration, fails even to credit the Governor and his "team" with the current and future responsibilities for better government. Thus, Mr. Black has failed to admit a single point in Sigler's favor—and he knows, or ought to know, that there are many so to list.

Skillsman Opposes Sigler

In my opinion, it is highly regrettable that Gene Black has resorted to the tools of "personalities" in his current feud with Sigler. You will recall that at that Board meeting Black sought funds for grand jury operations in Detroit and Flint; it was turned down by State Treasurer D. Hale Brake; but at that meeting Sigler announced his intention to call the Legislature's Emergency Appropriations Committee into session July 12 to give Black the requested funds—and, at Sigler's direction, I sent out the necessary telegrams and letters that very afternoon to accomplish such a mission.

Well, folks, the campaign is on with vigor. I'll have more to say about it as the weeks go on in the meantime, learn all you can about it, from both sides, to see which the way we can keep America free!

Traffic Safety Posters Will Be Erected in City

Plans for the erection of traffic safety street-side posters standard to carry posters identical with those used successfully in Detroit for many years were announced this week by the Traffic Safety Committee of South Oakland County.

The Traffic Safety Committee, which is comprised of representatives from seven South Oakland County communities, said that this was the first phase of a broad program aimed at preventing traffic accidents. Serve as Constant Reminders

The Traffic Safety Committee was formed on the recommendation of the IACP as the co-ordinating committee for all phases of the program. It consists of the city managers of the seven communities. They are: E. M. Shaffer, Royal Oak, who was appointed chairman; J. F. Gibbs, Ferndale; C. C. Congdon, Berkeley; D. J. Egbert, Birmingham; F. W. Liddle, Hazel Park; A. J. Berst, Pleasant Ridge; and Glen Ladd, Clawson.

The committee said that each community would have from eight to fifteen, standard placed generally in locations where volumes of traffic are heavy. Some of the communities, however, will erect them in their residential districts. The posters, which are constant reminders to drivers of their responsibilities in operating a motor vehicle and are directed against major accident causes.

Nine in Birmingham

Nine of these posters will be erected at strategic points in Birmingham, Egbert said. Definite locations have not been determined yet.

The posters will be furnished by the Traffic Safety Association of Detroit, a private, non-profit organization whose sole object is to prevent traffic accidents. The Association, in co-operation with the Traffic Engineering Bureau of Detroit, has placed these effective reminders to drivers on the streets of Detroit for seven years.

It is hoped the standards will be erected before the new school term begins.
