Five boys were honored for advancing to the rank of Second Class Scout: Tom Dinnel, Leon Pariseau, Frank Phillips, Roger Webster and Richard Stantton, Buchanan, and the two Emery boys.

Ross and Robert Riley were received into the Troop as Tenderfoot Scouts.

Troop B-1, which is sponsored by the Men's Club of the First Presbyterian Church, will have a week in camp this summer, beginning July 11.

Marshall Fredericks Attends Unveiling of Work in Kentucky

Marshall Fredericks, noted Birmingham sculptor, attended the unveiling of the huge relief, only exterior decoration of the Times Building in Louisville, Ky., last Thursday. Fredericks designed the relief, which depicts scenes typical of Kentucky.

Made of green patinated bronze against a background of black polished granite, the relief shows figures of early pioneers, native animals, river boats, horses and the tobacco workers of the state. The 14-foot square is over the main entrance of the building, which houses Louisville's two papers, the Courier-Journal and the Times.

Mrs. Harry Bingham, wife of the owner of the two papers, unveiled the work.

Photo Exhibition at Public Library  
The Birmingham YMCA and Birminghams Public Library have arranged a showing of "The Holy Land", a photographic exhibition prepared by the editors of Life magazine, beginning June 7 and continuing through June 12.

Based on a Life photographic essay and including many hitherto unpublished pictures, the exhibition consists of twenty 22 x 28 photographs by Dmitri Kessel, one of Life's most distinguished photographers.

To obtain this photographic record of the Land of the Bible, Kessel made a month's pilgrimage from Dan to Beersheba, devoting most of his time to such scenes in and near Jerusalem as the court of the Gentiles, Herod's Gate, Mount of Olives, Dome on the Rock, and the Garden of Gethsemane. Included in the exhibition are also photographs of Bethlehem; The Vale of Elah, where David slew Goliath; Jericho; Shiloh, where the Ark of Covenant first rested permanently; and other sites rich in biblical legend and fact.
