GIRL SCOUTS Plans for Open Hunt Club Horse Show June 24-27 Are Nearing Completion

Beginning Thursday, June 24, and continuing through Sunday, June 27, the annual Detroit Horse Show will take place at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club on East Long Lake road in Bloomfield Hills.
This year the Birmingham Lions Club is handling the advance ticket sales, the general door admission tickets and will also manage the parking for the event. It has been announced that the Lions will receive 50 percent of those proceeds for their charitable work in the Leader Dog school in Rochester, for the aid of needy children and for their work in helping those with defective vision.
The first day of the show will be devoted to the junior riders. Classes will begin at ten in the morning and continue throughout the day.
Included in these events are two stake classes for hunters and jumpers and the Joan Coulson Perpetual Memorial trophy for the winner of the junior working hunt. This event requires the competitor to perform over the outside course which is about three quarters of a mile in length and which simulates conditions normally met in the hunting field.
Friday and Saturday events will begin in the afternoon and will continue through the evening under lights. These classes include competition for western and walking horses, three and five-gaited classes as well as hunter and jumping events.
There will be an on-class for three-gaited horses, one for five-gaited horses and one for hunters and jumpers.
There is also a working hunter stake and a stake for each of the western and walking horse divisions.
Besides the stakes there are trophy classes which are an establishment.
