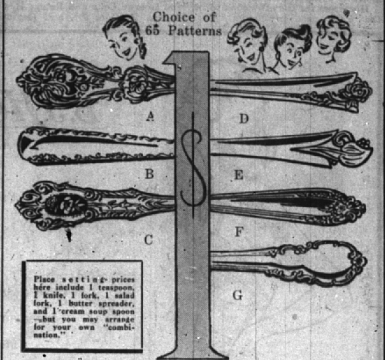
AAUW Final Event Is Picnic Today
