Grand Opening of Joint Firms Planned Tomorrow

The Liberty Cleaners and Hatters, a Birmingham business concern since 1929, will hold its grand opening in their new building at 123 West Maple this week end. Liberty Cleaners occupied the old building there until it was "torn down" last March by owner Charles J. Shain. Shain owns the new building which is modern throughout and has a diagonal front.

Theodore Mitchell founded the business 19 years ago and in September, 1948, a plant was erected at Hunter and Haynes. The customer's reception department will still be maintained at the plant for the convenience of customers to whom that location is more advantageous.

Hats are displayed in a new manner, being hung flat against the wall instead of stacked on counter surface. New Interior
Finished in soft greys, the interior of the store is livened by the clever use of red display shelves. The ceiling-flush lights give perfect lighting throughout the entire building, with almost no perceptible shadows. As a welcome to its new customers, beginning Friday, the store will give one piece of excellent Acorns luggage each day for six successive days. The front of the store, located at 123 West Maple, has been redesigned to conform with the new interior, offering a new and pleasing appearance to all.
