Venezuelan Folklore Is Theme of Exhibit at Cranbrook in June

During the month of June, the Cranbrook Institute of Science, will exhibit a series of photographs of celebration of St. John's Day in the Barlovento region of Venezuela made by Francisco Edmundo Perez, photographer of the Caracas newspaper, El Nacional.

In the state of Miranda, just east of Caracas, Negro and mestizo farmers and fishermen gather about mid-June for a fortnight of revelry combining frenzied African rites and the ancient European celebration of St. John the Baptist feast on June 24. Outbursts of song and shouting accent an orgy of rhythmic processions, night-long watches and fiestas, highlighted by traditional drum dances. The photographic record of this event is depicted in forty panels.

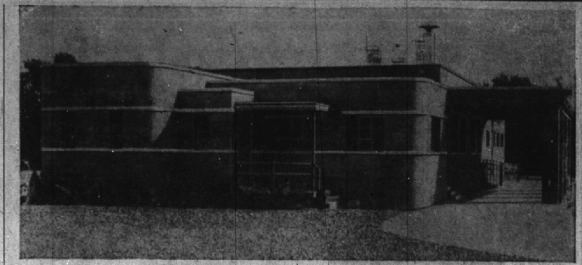
The Pan American Union is circulating these photographs, prepared under the auspices of the Bureau of Folklore Research Division of the Venezuelan Ministry of Education. They were originally exhibited in Caracas in connection with the official inauguration of the Bureau's headquarters and have also been on view in Bogota, Columbia and Havana, Cuba.

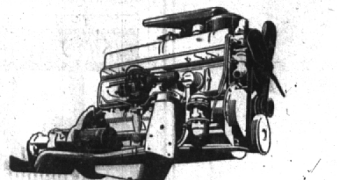
