They tell the exciting story of his voyage from Boston to New Zealand; discovery of the Devil's Graveyard, greatest ice producing center in the world, with the icebergs pounded by a terrific storm; building Little America II; battling the ice pack; exploring by dog-team and plane; life in the shadow of the South Pole.

Admiral Byrd is the only explorer to fly over both Poles. He has looked on more square miles in unknown areas than any human in all history. He served with distinction in both World Wars. In the last one he was overseas four times and was cited or decorated four times.

To the qualified Electors:

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the City of Bloomfield Hills, in the County of Oakland and State of Michigan, on Monday, April 5, 1948, in the Municipal Building on East Long Lake Road for the purpose of electing the following officers:

Two City Commissioners and One Constable

And to vote on the following propositions:

A. Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes, which may be assessed each year against property in the County of Oakland, State of Michigan, for all purposes except taxes for the payment of interest and principal on obligations incurred prior to December 8, 1932, be increased as provided in Section 21, Article X, of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of two (2) years from 1948 to 1949, both inclusive, by one-fifth (1/5) of one per cent (\$2.00 per \$1000.00) of the assessed valuation, as equalized, to permit the levying of a two (2) mill tax for the purpose of altering the present Infirmary, constructing a Hospital addition thereto, and equipping the same?

B. Shall a tax of two (2) mills (\$2.00 per \$1000.00) be levied on all of the assessable property in the County of Oakland, State of Michigan, in the years 1948 and 1949, both inclusive, for the purpose of altering the present Infirmary, constructing a Hospital addition thereto, and equipping the same?


