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LWV Members Hear Assessor Describe How July City Tax Will Be Figured

Taxes were again the subject of the morning session of the last official meeting of the League of Women Voters until fall held Monday at the Birmingham Community House.

Fully equipped with tax primer tabulated information on Birmingham assessments, maps showing the outlines of the various school districts, the townships and the city color maps and rulers, League members listened attentively to Elmer Haack, Birmingham assessor, who complimented the League for taking the time to study this matter. He said he would like to see the city will divide the July city tax and how the county figures the December school and county tax.

On being asked for suggestions about ways in which the League could be active regarding city and county taxes, Haack stated that it is important that the citizens know about the assessor's work, so that if he is not doing a good job something can be done about it. He added that the Board of Review is always glad to receive suggestions from those who feel they are not being assessed properly on their property.

He said the Birmingham system is good as the City Commission has seen fit to provide it with machinery to carry out what they expect. He advised that it is important to know if your local assessments are properly equalized; that the League could be a definite influence on the assessor's office, by checking the tax rolls and the property in the city and other units in the county.

Mrs. Covert Robinson, chairman of the meeting, stated that this meeting was just a step, one local basis, toward the purpose of the national program of the League of Women Voters to educate the average citizen on problems of taxation. This committee is one of the most important matters on the agenda of the National League.

Convention Report
The maps, the tax primer and other information were prepared by Mrs. William Eesey and Mrs. E. V. Clarke. Mrs. Eesey asked every League member to plan to attend the City Commission meeting on Tuesday, June 1, originally scheduled for the last Monday in May when the city budget will be adopted.

The afternoon session, presided over by Mrs. E. Garrison, president of the Birmingham League, was highlighted by reports on the national convention of the League held at Grand Rapids. Mrs. Graham Shinnick's report was read by Mrs. Philip Pretz, and Mrs. Garrison reported on the regional agreements which culminated in a constitution at the Bogota conference.

Mrs. Garrison, who in a special set in political conditions in South America, stated that the South American regional agreements are the grandfathers of our present day regional agreements, on which we will have to depend for a peace until the UN is stronger.

Gathers Up Loose Ends
She also stated that the recent meeting in Bogota gathered up the loose ends of all the eight meetings in the past 40 years into one organization, which is coming into being, and is to be called "The Organization of American States," a resolution that all of the states in this organization are against international Communist activity and all forms of totalitarianism; and an Inter-American Defense Council composed of the members of all countries to work for mutual defense.

States of Trade Renewal
Mrs. Philip Pretz reported the status of legislation on the Reciprocal Trade Agreement renewals which she did not expect the relations between the United States and South America, but rather presented them, as the only way that the latter can develop is through U. S. capital.
