Hal Lehrman, principal speaker, has chosen for his subject "Why I Changed My Mind About Rus-

As a liberal journalist, an anti-communist, yet sympathetic to the Russian people, he went into the Balkans while war still raged. He criss-crossed through Russian occupied territory checking, and thinking of what he saw.

Lehrman, an correspondent of PM, the London News Chronicle, London Daily Express and Nation, spent 18 months in Central Europe and the Russian Balkans. Just 12 weeks ago he returned to the States.

Now in the process of preparing another book, "The Reporter in Search of Peace", Lehrman has already won renown for his "Russia's Europe".

Story of Soviet Union "Russia's Europe" details one of the most important and least known stories of our time: the story of how the Soviet Union, through economical and political penetration, has taken under control countries from the Baltic to the Aegean.

Leaves Diplomatic Service Visoianu is a Doctor of Law from the University of Paris. He started his career as secretary of the Joint Arbitral Tribunal, and his potentialities were at once recognized by Nicholas Titulescu, Rumanian minister to London.

In 1930, Visoianu was appointed to a position of the League of Nations staff in Geneva, and then in 1933 he was appointed Rumanian minister to the Hague, and in 1935, to Warsaw.

Slurby in Cairo for the Armistice negotiations. He then went to Moscow to take part in the final drafting of the Armistice convention, and after his return to Roumania, was appointed foreign minister in the Second Stanculescu government and later in General Radescu's government.

Last His Citizenship At the big political trial against Maniu and prominent members of the National Peasant Party in 1947, Visoianu was condemned to 15 year's penal servitude and to the confiscation of all his property for "the crime of conspiracy, high treason, attempt to undermine the constitutional order, rebellion against the constitution and illegal crossing of the frontier".

Alexandre Cretzianu, former Rumanian minister to Washington, entered the diplomatic service in 1918 and held various posts abroad. Later, he spent more than ten years in the Rumanian foreign office, first as head of the political division and then as secretary general. In 1941, he resigned in protest against Dictator Antonescu's policy.

In Conspiracy After two years of retirement, Cretzianu was with the view of approaching the Allies, as he already was one of the participants in the conspiracy to overthrow the German-dominated Antonescu regime, he worked in Turkey directly on behalf of King Michael and Maniu.

He made the preliminary arrangements for the Armistice negotiations with the Allies in Cairo, 1944, and acted as liaison officer between the Rumanian emissaries in Cairo and the Rumanian anti-fascist democratic parties, which were headed by Maniu's National Peasant Party.

Cretzianu remained minister until 1946. The Gozga government had already tried to recall him in 1945, but had been unable to do so because of the constitutional conflict between King Michael and Gozga.

He came to the United States in 1946 and has since been speaking to the American public of conditions in his country.

As with Visoianu, Cretzianu was deprived of his citizenship and his property was confiscated.
